





# Moth trapping at Stillingfleet Lodge Nurseries (SE 589409) from June 2012 Onwards

Following a request from Mrs Vanessa Cook for representatives of Butterfly Conservation, Yorkshire Branch to attend a "Conservation Day" in the grounds of Stillingfleet Lodge it was agreed to install moth traps within the grounds and to display the catches to the visiting public at the event. As with much of the early summer in 2012 the weather was not very conducive to flying insects, although a reasonable number of specimens were caught and retained in small seethrough containers to enable them to be viewed by the visitors. In spite of the damp conditions a good number of visitors did attend to support the stall set up by Butterfly Conservation, alongside several other attendee conservation groups. The following reports are written by David Baker who was accompanied on all the visits, unless noted otherwise, by David laughlin.

The word "trap" alarms some people who associate the word with killing etc. However, no moths were harmed in the exercise and all were released after counting and, in this instance, displaying to other interested parties during the afternoon.

At the end of the day we agreed to carry out further trapping later on in the year and, perhaps in following years, to try to assess the species of moths flying in the area of the Lodge and the following lists show the results of further trapping at the site. The three 2012 sessions, separated by several weeks, showed a great variety of moths with repeat species being very few and a total of 94 species were recorded. 65 of these were macro-moths with a smaller number, i.e. 29, being micro-moths. 2012 results follow:-

## Night 2012/1

Vanessa greeted us on the Saturday evening with a warning of a very poor weather forecast and, in fact, some rain did fall but not sufficient to dampen the spirits of many local moths.

## <u>Night 2017/2</u>

After a very mild spell we set up on Saturday evening of **25<sup>th</sup> March** with the promise of a very cold, although shorter, night from the TV forecasters on the final day of "Winter-time".

They were correct: After scraping the car windscreen at home at 0730 on Sunday we then found a silvery frost on the grass in the car-park area at the Nurseries. However, moths do not acknowledge "British Summer Time" and know full well that there is no such thing as a lost, or even an extra, hour. Our catch was far better than we expected and we recorded 10 species of macro-moth, with a total of 78 specimens, two species of which were new to the site as shown below in red.

In total we recorded 11 species of micros of which 3 were new to site and 42 species of macros of which 6 species were newcomers.

# Night 2017/6


Things were going reasonably well on the mothing front when we set up on Saturday  $15^{\rm th}$  July.

## Night 2018 / 4a

To make up for the disappointment of last week which, it turned out, was a mistake on my part. I had not either removed, or re-set, the time-clocks I used at the Yorkshire Air Museum the previous week. Well, nobody's perfect!!

All went well and a very good night's recording on 30<sup>th</sup> June was managed. 59 species were recorded of which 5 were new to the site. The highlight, because of its size, was the Pine Hawk-moth which, at the time, we thought was a new sighting. However, the records showed that we had seen 3 in one night in July 2014.

For me the Suspected was the best newcomer. I have only recorded it at the Yorkshire Air Museum on a couple of occasions. It was surprising that the Garden Tiger and Common Emerald were new to site and it just shows that gaps of up to four weeks can make recording a bit hit and miss.



Temperatures were still reasonably high when we set up on **3**<sup>rd</sup> **August** and we spent a long time in emptying the traps, counting specimens and releasing them into the adjacent foliage. In all we had 76 species of moth which included 3 newcomers to the site. Better still 2 of the newcomers were scarce migrants. The micro-moth *Loxostege sticticalis* is rarely seen in Yorkshire and after a few sightings during the 1990's the latest was at Beverley in 2012. The **Bedstraw Hawk-moth** is seen more regularly in Yorkshire and the closest to this site was in the Riccall area several years ago.
